

Playing Facts & Fracts at Home on a Chromebook

For schools that use Clever

Good news — there is nothing to install.

On a Chromebook your student does not need the Clever app or the Facts & Fracts app. Everything runs right inside the Chrome browser, exactly the way it does at school. Three steps and they are playing.

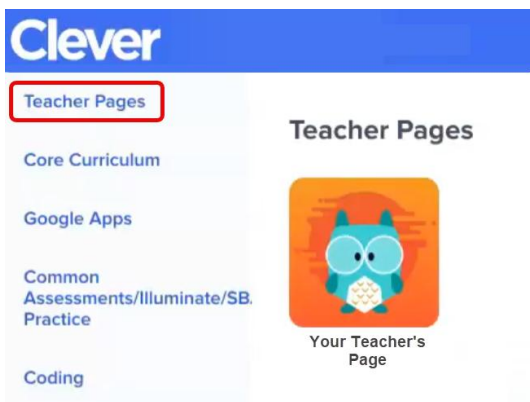
Three steps

1 Open Chrome and sign in to Clever.

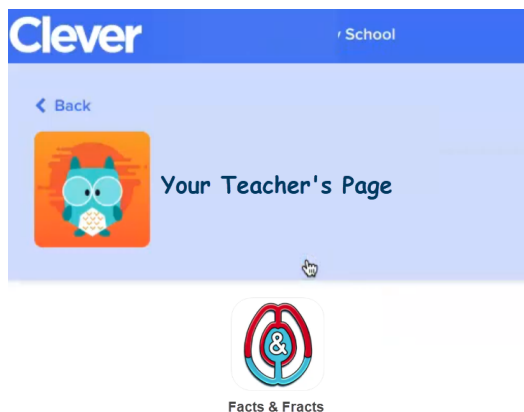
Go to your school's Clever page, or to clever.com/login. Your student's username and password come from their school — the same ones they use in class. (Sign in on the Clever website; there is no app to open.)

2 Find the Facts & Fracts icon.

It is usually on the “Teacher Pages” section rather than the main Clever home screen. Click “Teacher Pages,” then open your teacher's page.



Look for “Teacher Pages” in the left menu.



Then click the Facts & Fracts icon.

Three steps, continued

3 Click it — the game opens and logs your student in.

Facts & Fracts loads right in the browser tab and signs your student in automatically. The first load can take a few seconds. That's it — they play exactly the way they do at school.



When you see this screen, your student is signed in and ready to play.

One thing to remember each day

Always start from Clever — don't bookmark the game itself. Launching from Clever is what signs your student in, so a saved bookmark or a stale tab won't have a fresh login. If the game ever closes or asks them to sign in, just go back to Clever and click the icon again.

A few notes

- **Any Chromebook works.** A school Chromebook or a personal one at home — both are fine. Nothing needs to be installed on either.
- **On a phone or tablet, it's different.** iPhone, iPad and Android devices DO need the free Facts & Fracts app. Step-by-step instructions for those are at edtechgames.com/support.
- **If your school uses ClassLink or Schoology instead of Clever.** On a Chromebook the idea is the same: sign in to that portal in Chrome and click the Facts & Fracts icon. Nothing to install.
- **If the game runs slowly or won't load.** Close other tabs and try again. If it still won't start, the Troubleshooting section at edtechgames.com/support has the common fixes.
